II. Course Description:

It is aimed to develop the students' abilities to read and comprehend English language texts. Here the students will be moved to more difficult text s, understanding the main ideas, guessing meanings from the contexts, making inferences, and summarizing passages in their own words. In this course, the students will do some more tasks on scanning and skimming so as to improve their abilities in reading for different purposes.
